COURSE DESCRIPTION

Caring for People God's Way II is the second term includes Unit Three and Unit Four.

Caring for People God's Way III is the third term and ends with Unit Five.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Students will identify their spiritual gifts and discuss how they hope to use these gifts in life and ministry.
- 2. Students will identify and discuss what personal characteristics are important in a people helper.
- 3. Students will explain in writing: how marriages stay healthy and out of the 'danger zone' of disaffection.
- 4. Students will analyze/design their family-system and identify patterns that have carried over to their current lives.
- 5. Students will learn basic skills and practices in people helping. They will demonstrate these skills in class with other participants.
